REPORT – (WEDNESDAY 4 OCT) DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S VISIT

During his visit to our club, **District Governor Bob Ryan** congratulated our club on our numerous projects, commenting that we punch above our weight. This year's very apt Theme is '**Rotary: Making A Difference**', and we can be proud that we continue to make a difference, particularly in our own community. Rotary is about ordinary people doing things for others because we can.



The DG showed video of Australian Rotarian **Ian Riseley** taking over the top job, Rotary International President; the video showed his speech and the presentation. Bob outlined Ian Riseley's focus for the year: **protecting the environment and curbing climate change**, which are essential to Rotary's goal of **sustainable service**. The president-elect challenged every Rotary club to make a difference by planting a tree for each of its members between the start of the Rotary year on 1 July and Earth Day on 22 April 2018. Trees remove carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases from the air, which slows global warming. (We've made a start, with the Avocado tree given to the Community Garden).

Margaret Ryan spoke on her Partners Project - **Stem Cell Regeneration in the Muscle Tissue of the Heart**. She aims to raise \$40,000 to create a PhD Scholarship for Research in this area. The successful student applicant is expected to begin the research in January 2018. One person dies of Heart Disease every 26 minutes. It is the biggest killer of all in Australia. The heart is not able to repair itself after damaged from (eg) a heart attack. The PhD work will consist of experiments with mice, as their heart structure is similar enough to a human heart.

AUCTION 7 OCT REPORT

The auction was very successful, with the second-best return for this calendar year. A substantial chunk of this was due to pre-sales, due to **Dick Matthews'** hard work. Many of us were away, so the load fell more heavily on the few who were here. Our helpers were **Woolgoolga Rural Fire Service**, assisted by the **Sandy Beach** brigade, and we thank them for their hard work.
