NYSF Quinn Watson We received a very positive Thank you email from our National Youth Science Forum candidate from Year 11 2021, Quinn Watson. Our club sponsored Quinn \$900 towards the full cost of \$1900. Quinn was also able to attain a grant of \$250 towards his travel and accommodation expenses. The Forum was held early in January and proved to be a very positive experience for Quinn. His email was very impressive and comprehensive, explaining why the Forum for him, was so successful. One part of his email stated: "Although I went into the program with a relatively narrow mindset, these presentations, in addition to informing me, have also had me consider a variety of other fields, the two of which most intrigued me are defence engineering and mechanical engineering. I might take a general first course in university, and I guess my field of choice will remain to be

seen after that." Quinn is also very willing to attend one of our meetings to give us "a more in-depth talk on his experience". We look forward to meeting him.

It's great to see progress on the Wiigulga Multi Purpose Centre. Our Rotary \$20,000 pledge will be called upon soon. (WHS students are keen on a 'youth space': with seating, a platform, wifi, ...). The Centre will have a state of the art basketball court and 4 rooms that can be opened up to cater for 200 people. Two very large LED screens will be included.
