Over the past few years we have tried a number of strategies to address our declining membership, so far to no avail. Does our club have a future?

Quoting from the **Minutes of our May 16th Board meeting**: Does our club need to hand in our Charter because of small membership numbers and members' availability? What is the process? What needs to be decided? Discussion to continue at meeting 6 June. Members asked to attend and bring ideas. Issues to be sorted will include Rotary Shed, Term Balance Funds, remaining funds disbursement, etc.

In recent years we have tried several different strategies to increase membership, including promotion of community projects, free first year membership, media releases, inclusion of Friends of Rotary, leafleting pamphlets, ...

**Do we try one more time** to use local media to inform members of the community that unless several (6 or more?) people step up **Woolgoolga will lose its Rotary club?** Do we 'hand over' our Charter to another group of people? What happens to our ongoing projects?

President Kim will lead the discussion on Monday.

What might be the implications for our Changeover on June 20th? Do we cancel?

At what stage does our **District Governor** (and others) become involved?

If you are unable to attend our Assembly but would like to have an input, email your comments to one of our Board members by Monday morning June 6th.

## WIIGULGA SITE VISIT FOR ROTARY AND OTHER SPONSORS


Our club was invited to a very special visit to the Wiigulga Sports Complex, on the northern fringe of Woolgoolga, which is under construction. Patty Delaney and David Fayle were most impressed with progress. The front entrance is nicely designed and will have iconic artwork. The multipurpose rooms are very flexibly configured and will attract a wide variety of use. The main hall is immense, and has a large stage, with disabled access and a Green Room (not viewable yet). Drop down basketball hoops and a huge central curtain are already in place. Among many other features is a large commercial kitchen, with organisations already enthusiastically queuing to use.

The separate amenities block, the new sporting fields with LED lighting, drainage

and irrigation, cricket nets, and the site of the pump track and other community-funded facilities were also shown. Not so

visible was the large investment in ensuring sustainability and minimising operating cost, with solar electricity, insulation, and water recycling. The invitees represented local organisations that have pledged funding totaling \$187,000 for enhancements to this magnificent project. As well as our \$20,000 pledge, other sponsors are: both Guru Nanak and 1st Sikh temples; Lions; Garden Club; Red Cross; RSL (Diggers) Club; Woolgoolga and Northern Beaches Chamber of Commerce; Woodsey's Wheels; Performing Arts Studio; Costa Group; and Seaview Tavern.

The core project has been well funded by all three levels of government, and our community is very grateful to them, to those delivering the project, and of course to Alastair Milroy and his committee for the amazing work they continue to do to bring the Wiigulga Sports Complex to fruition. If all goes well, community use will be possible starting in the last few months of this year.
