Rod has discussed his thinking about draft plans for 2023-24. A morning information session will be held at Wiigulga Sports Centre on Friday 23 June at 7am to give an overview of Rotary and promote membership. Light refreshments will be served. Marketing of this event will soon begin, using Facebook, our Website, social and mainstream media, emails, face to face and other invitations. Rod would like suggestions from members of people and businesses to invite, with their contact details including emails.

As we come out of the last few years of Covid and lockdowns Rod is looking at aspects of our club and how it can run in a freer environment. These include member engagement, communication and feedback, meetings, projects, fund raising and priorities, budget, goals, membership, marketing, promotion, visibility and club image, guest speakers, visits, social events, networking, grants and joint ventures with other organisations. Rod would like feedback and suggestions from members on their ideas for the Club, suggestions, likes and dislikes, and what would make our club sustainable with more members and its activities better and more enjoyable. The best way to do this is by email which can be more easily collated.

It's proposed to have a **member's club planning session** on **Monday 19 June** to get member input to the draft plan. A working plan for the year would then be presented at our first meeting in July.

LAST MEETING: Charlie and Riley from Woolgoolga High School gave an interesting and informative talk about RYAG which they attended at Walcha in February and March 2023. RYAG went for a week and was attended by 30 students, 10 of them boys and 20 of them girls. It was a very hands on week and involved visiting several farms one of which had 10,000

sheep and 500 cattle. They were shown and experienced things like artificial insemination of sheep, low stress strategies for looking after and moving sheep, judging and classing sheep to improve sale prices, sheep sales, the technology used on the farm including tagging, data collection and classifications. They saw sheep dog training and the logistics of livestock transport which included moving sheep overseas. One of the farms that they visited produces fine wool which is sold into Italy for making high quality suits. They also saw the genetic mixing for breeding sheep to meet different farm conditions in different regions. They took part in live sheep appraisal to judge the meat and the fat on the sheep by touch and sight and visited shearing sheds and saw wool classing, fleece throwing and laser wool testing for fine micron wool. The week finished up with a dinner and a dress up and both students enjoyed it and learnt a lot. They thanked Rotary for helping fund their attendance at RYAG and their talk was well appreciated. They were excellent candidates to go on that particular program.
