




WOOPI COMMUNITY GARDENS OPEN DAY Sunday 24th September 10am to 3pm

Our plan to share a site with the Lions Club fell by the wayside as their marquee was full of bbg ingredients and cooking gear. Several of our members, Christopher, Kim, Dick, Bronwyn and Rod were there to promote Rotary and our Domestic Violence phones project. We chatted to several people interested in bringing in their old phones so our being there was worthwhile. The day was opened with a welcome to country, a young

indigenous dance group and Jack Thompson reading two poems, Clancy of the Overflow and Turbulence. A relaxed day with music, garden tours, food, scarecrows and garden goods for sale. It was most enjoyable socialising with other members of our club, their families and friends.



MHERV (THE MEN'S HEALTH EDUCATION RURAL VAN) Rotary Clubs around Australia have organised the MHERV van for men's health. Since 2017 MHERV has been out in the backblocks of NSW on two scheduled tours per year seeking out the menfolk who haven't seen the inside of a doctor's rooms for years. These are the blokes who drop dead in a paddock, because nobody saw it coming. 41,000 Australian men die of preventable diseases each year. 12,356 have



g been tested by the MHERV project since 2017. 5,891 were found to be in need of treatment. 441 were in immediate danger of a stroke or heart attack. Our club is hosting the van for 2 nights on 17th and 18th October. Dick will coordinate advertising of the van and organise a parking area for the 18th October so the nurse will be able to test members of our Community who wish to call into the van during the day.
