



We had a very successful day, geared towards helping with the increasing cost of living. All items for the sale were priced at only \$10 which proved very popular with the passing parade with many coming in to look and just as many purchasing one or two items. The raffle proved just as popular with two buckets of groceries and a box of fresh fruit and veg up for grabs. We must thank the generosity of a few of our Rotary members, The McIntosh family, the Witcombes, the Mackenzies and Alison Ratlif not only for





donations to the raffle but spending their morning manning the stall. A big thank you must also go to Phoonies Fresh Fruit and Vegetables who donated a fabulous box of fresh goodies. Please check out the shop in Beach Street, mention you are from Rotary and express appreciation for the generous donation. The raffle winners were Regina and Scott

(market stall holders), Lou and Pam (both locals). The tickets were drawn, once again, by Dave from Marine Rescue. This was our second best market and raffle. To date we have raised over \$3,000. The raffles (including the dutch auction) contributing

over \$1,700 to the total. A great effort! So far we have donated \$300 to the Coffs Coast Wildlife Sanctuary, paid site fees for the market stalls and purchased some necessary hardware items for the stall. We have also been able to proudly display our new Rotary marquee (purchased through a federal grant) at the last two markets.



RAWCS (Rotary Australia World Community Service) has Drought Cards worth a total of more than \$100,000 to give away to Rotary clubs to distribute to drought impacted individuals in your communities. Each one of our Drought Cards has a value of \$500 which can be used at any place in Australia where EFTPOS are accepted. The cards are valid until 31st December 2024 and must be used before then. Rod has received 4 of these vouchers for distribution to those affected in our North Coast area.
